



NEC4 is coming on 22nd June 2017

Changes include:

- ❖A Design Build Operate Contract (DBO) Contract
- *X12 is changed from 'Partnering' to 'Multi-Party Collaboration'
- Contractor proposals (for opportunities inc. whole life costs)
- Consensual dispute resolution & avoidance board clauses
- Early Contractor Involvement (ECI) clauses
- ❖Building Information Modelling (BIM) clauses





Single Stage vs Two Stage for collaboration?

If you want quality responses / proposals, why on earth would you single stage tender to the whole market?

You would be setting the project up for FAILURE





Which contracts be used to incentivise the Parties to collaborate under two stage tendering?

Yes, on Priced contracts:

- VE/opportunity clauses can be used to incentivise Contractor suggestions
- ❖ Bonuses for early Completion and KPIs with incentives attached can be used to incentivise performance which exceeds the contractual minimum i.e. superior performance.







Which contracts be used to incentivise the Parties to collaborate under two stage tendering?


Target cost contracts share pain / gain and provide transparency of cost for Employer/Contractor collaboration.











Which contracts be used to incentivise the Parties to collaborate under two stage tendering?

- Target cost contracts share pain / gain and provide transparency of cost for Employer/Contractor collaboration.
- ECI clauses do what they say on the tin and under NEC ECI, the pain/gain can be around the Employer's budget.
- Alliancing arrangements incentivise the core team of suppliers to work together for mutual benefit.





Summary

JCT vs. NEC3 ?

NEC3 has a bit more than a bit of an edge.

NEC4 will have definite edge.

Single/two stage tendering ?

Two stage hands down.

Which contracts can be best used to incentivise the Parties to collaborate under 2 stage tendering?

Depends on contract circumstances and 'best fit' contracting strategy. NEC3 has more flexibility and NEC4 even more so.
